FROM THE PRESIDENT

The musicians and sold-out audience at our March gig again demonstrated that the Wellington Jazz Club is in fine fettle. Our featured act, the *Liberty Swing Band*, displayed wonderfully tight ensemble playing with many big band favourites, especially from Count Basie's repertoire. As well as other old favourites such as Bye Bye Blackbird and Mack the Knife, the band ventured into interesting takes on some more modern numbers including three of my favourites – Smooth (Santana), Baker Street (Gerry Rafferty) and Moondance (Van Morrison). The last of these has become a real jazz standard and, of course, Van started out as an alto sax player! We had excellent vocals from Jo-Anne Gibbs and Caleb Tawa, while John Jones (Musical Director) led the band expertly.

The March gig also included our AGM which saw the following officers and committee members elected: Arthur Grimes Kelly (Vice-President). (President), Graham Michael Bain (Treasurer), Justine Croft (Secretary), Brian Vincent (Committee member), Nik Straugheir (Committee member), and Helen Thompson (Committee member). Helen has agreed to take on the Newsletter editing role - which has been so ably conducted by Brian Vincent for many years. Nik remains as joint gigs coordinator (with assistance from myself). I am immensely thankful to my predecessors as President over the past year -Justine Croft and Michael Bain – and to the rest of the committee, for ensuring that the club is now in such great shape. I also wish to thank our patron, The Rt Hon Sir Anand Satyanand for his entertaining address to the AGM (see later in the Newsletter).

BACKGROUND ON OUR NEXT GIG HIP-TOWN BANGERS

Our April gig features *Hip-Town Bangers*, a stand-out act from the 2023 Wellington Jazz Festival. The band, led by Ben Hunt (trumpet), will re-create Art Blakey's blues-soaked classic album, *The Big Beat*. Art Blakey (and the Jazz Messengers) recorded the album in 1960, with the band comprising Lee Morgan (trumpet), Wayne Shorter (saxophone), Bobby Timmons (piano), Jymie Merritt (bass) and Blakey on drums.

Ben Hunt is joined at Meow by an all-star line-up of Chris Buckland (tenor sax), Anita Schwabe (piano), Emma Hattaway (double bass) and Michael Jensen (drums). In 2022, Ben Hunt presented the *Kind of Blue* (Miles Davis) album recreation at the jazz club, with a similar lineup of musicians – a performance which then President Mike Bain described as "a brilliant performance". If you missed their show at the last jazz festival, or if you missed their 2022 show, make sure you get along to Meow on 21 April – you will not be disappointed!

As always, I wish to thank Meow for hosting our gigs – it's a great space for jazz gigs. I encourage members to join Nick Tipping's distribution list that publicises upcoming jazz events; his email address is 'wgtnjazzclub@gmail.com'. I also encourage members to invite non-members along to gigs. Non-members can benefit by converting their (non-member) entry ticket for a gig to an initial free membership of the club for the remainder of the calendar year.

Art Blakey 11 October 1919 – 16 October 1990

Arthur Blakey was an American jazz drummer and bandleader. He was also known as Abdullah Ibn Buhaina after he converted to Islam for a short time in the late 1940s. He made a name for himself in the 1940s in the big bands of Fletcher Henderson and Billy Eckstine. He then worked with bebop musicians Thelonious Monk, Charlie Parker, and Dizzy Gillespie. In the 1950s Horace Silver and Blakey formed the Jazz Messengers, a group which he led for the next 35 years.

Blakey was inducted into the Down Beat Jazz Hall of Fame (in 1981). Posthumously, he was inducted into the Modern Drummer Hall of Fame in 1991 and the Grammy Hall of Fame (in 1998 and 2001). He was awarded the Grammy Lifetime Achievement Award in 2005.
